

Welcome

Welcome to the solemn mass for Maundy Thursday. Please join in all the parts that are marked in **bold print** to say or sing together.

We welcome all who are baptized and have been admitted to communion to receive. Please follow the direction of the stewards. If you haven't been baptized, or don't receive communion, you may approach the priest, bow your head and ask for a blessing – otherwise, please remain in your seats. Please keep silence during this important and holy moment, so that others around you may pray in peace.

Please do not receive from the chalice if you are feeling at all unwell, have or are recovering from Covid in the last few days or have any mouth ulcers or broken lips. Please do not 'intinct' the host (that is, dip it in the chalice).



There is a **loop system** and those who wish to make use of this should turn their hearing aids to "T"



Please make sure that your mobile phone is switched off.



Before mass begins, you are asked to keep **silence**, remembering that you have come into the presence of God, whom we worship.

The Liturgy of the Word

Sit

The First Reading

Exodus 12:1-4, 11-14

A reading from the book of Exodus

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbour in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it. This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the Lord. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgements: I am the Lord. The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.

This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the Lord; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

This is the word of the Lord.

The Holy Gospel

John: 13:1-17, 31b-35

The Gospel is read on this night as an enacted parable. No lights or incense are used.

The Lord be with you And also with you

► Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John Glory to you, O Lord

Now before the festival of the Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart from this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. The devil had already put it into the heart of Judas son of Simon Iscariot to betray him. And during supper Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, got up from the table, took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him.

The Washing of Feet

Amen.

Please sit

He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, 'Lord, are you going to wash my feet?' Jesus answered, 'You do not know now what I am doing, but later you will understand.' Peter said to him, 'You will never wash my feet.' Jesus answered, 'Unless I wash you, you have no share with me.' Simon Peter said to him, 'Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!' Jesus said to him, 'One who has bathed does not need to wash, except for the feet, but is entirely clean. And you are clean, though not all of you.' For he knew who was to betray him; for this reason he said, 'Not all of you are clean.'

After he had washed their feet, had put on his robe, and had returned to the table, he said to them, 'Do you know what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord—and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you. Very truly, I tell you, servants are not greater than their master, nor are messengers greater than the one who sent them. If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them.

When he had gone out, Jesus said, 'Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, "Where I am going, you cannot come." I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.'

When the Principal Celebrant has returned to the chair, we stand. He then prays:

Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us that what we do for the least of our brothers and sisters we do also for you: give us the will to be the servant of others as you were the servant of all, and gave up your life and died for us, but are alive and reign, now and for ever. The Intercessions Remain standing

In the power of the Spirit let us pray to the Father through Christ the Saviour of the world.

Father on this, the night he was betrayed, your Son Jesus Christ washed his disciples feet. We commit ourselves to follow his example of love and service.

On this night, he accepted the cup of death and looked forward to the new wine of the Kingdom.

We remember those who have died in the peace of Christ.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

The Peace

Jesus says: 'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid.'

The Peace of the Lord be always with you And also with you.

Let us offer each other a sign of peace.

You are welcome to exchange a sign of peace with those immediately near you. Please respect the wishes of those who may not wish to do so.

The Preparation of the Altar

This is the night, dear friends, the night for weeping When powers of darkness overcomes the day, The night the faithful mourn the weight of evil, Whereby our sins the Son of Man betray.

This night the traitor, wolf within the sheepfold, Betrays himself into his victim's will; The Lamb of God for sacrifice preparing, Sin brings about the cure for sin's own ill.

This night Christ institutes His holy supper, Blest food and drink for heart and soul and mind; This night injustice joins its hand to treason's, And buys the ransom-price of humankind.

This night the Lord by slaves shall be arrested, He who destroys our slavery to sin; Accused of crime, to criminals be given, That judgement on the righteous judge begin.

O make us sharers, Saviour, of your Passion, That we may share your glory that shall be; Let us pass through these three dark nights of sorrow, To Easter's laughter and its liberty.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you And also with you

Lift up your hearts
We lift them to the Lord

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right to give you thanks, Father most holy, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

For on this night he girded himself with a towel and, taking the form of a servant, washed the feet of his disciples.

He gave us a new commandment that we should love one another as he has loved us.

Knowing that his hour had come, in his great love he gave this supper to his disciples to be a memorial of his passion, that we might proclaim his death until he comes again, and feast with him in his kingdom.

Therefore earth unites with heaven to sing a new song of praise; we too join with angels and archangels as they proclaim your glory without end:

The choir sings:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory, Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes, in the name of the Lord most high, Hosanna in the highest.

From the beginning, O God, all you have done for the human family you have done for our good, that we may be holy, as you yourself are holy.

Look with kindness, then, on your people gathered before you. Send forth your Spirit in power, that these gifts may become for us the body ♣ and blood of Jesus Christ, your beloved Son, in whom we too are your children.

When we were lost and our hearts were far from you, you showed the depth of your love: your Son, who alone is the Just One, gave himself into our hands and was nailed to the wood of the cross.

Before he stretched out his arms between heaven and earth as the lasting sign of your covenant, he desired to celebrate the Passover in the company of his disciples.

While they were at table, he took bread and gave you thanks and praise; he broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said:

Take this, all of you, and eat it:

This is my body, which will be given up for you.

At the end of the meal, knowing he would reconcile all things in himself by his blood poured out on the cross, he took the cup filled with wine; again he gave you thanks, and, handing the cup to his friends, he said: Take this, all of you, and drink from it: This is the cup of my blood, The blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for all, So that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.

Lord, by your cross and resurrection you have set us free. You are the Saviour of the world.

We remember Jesus Christ, our Passover and our lasting peace, we celebrate his death and resurrection, we await the blessed day of his return.


And so we present to you, God ever faithful and true, the offering that restores the world to your grace.

The Invitation

Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those who are invited to share in the banquet of the Lamb.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed.

The Priest then says the Communion Antiphon:

This is the Body that will be given up for you; this is the Chalice of the new covenant in my Blood, says the Lord; do this, whenever you receive it, in memory of me.

All Christians who are baptized and who are confirmed or have been admitted to Communion, are welcome to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion at this mass. You are asked, please <u>not</u> to intinct ('dip') the Host in the Precious Blood. Please receive the Host, consume it and then either receive from the chalice, or return to your seat.

The Prayer after Communion

Stand

Let us pray

Lord Jesus Christ, we thank you that in this wonderful sacrament you have given us the memorial of your passion: grant us so to reverence the sacred mysteries of your body and blood that we may know within ourselves and show forth in our lives the fruit of your redemption, for you are alive and reign, now and for ever.

Amen.

In silence, the preparations are now made for the transfer of the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose. When all is ready this hymn is sung:

Of the glorious Body telling, O my tongue, its mysteries sing, and the Blood, all price excelling, which the world's eternal King, in a spotless womb once dwelling shed for this world's ransoming.

Given for us, for us descending, of a Virgin to proceed, man with man in converse blending, scattered he the Gospel seed, till his sojourn drew to ending, which he closed in wondrous deed.

At the last great Supper lying circled by his chosen band, duly with the law complying, first he finished its command then, immortal Food supplying, gave himself by his own hand.

Word-made-Flesh, by word he maketh very bread his Flesh to be; man in wine Christ's Blood partaketh: and if senses fail to see, faith alone the true heart waketh to behold the mystery.

At the altar of repose, the Blessed Sacrament is set down, and the priest intones:

Therefore we, before him bending, this great Sacrament revere; types and shadows have their ending, for the newer rite is here; faith, our outward sense befriending, makes the inward vision clear.

Glory let us give, and blessing to the Father and the Son; honour, might and praise addressing, while eternal ages run; ever too his love confessing, who, from both, with both is one.

At the altar of repose, a period of silent contemplation is kept. This readings is then read:

Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane; and he said to his disciples, 'Sit here while I go over there and pray.' He took with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and began to be grieved and agitated. Then he said to them, 'I am deeply grieved, even to death; remain here, and stay awake with me.' And going a little farther, he threw himself on the ground and prayed, 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet not what I want but what you want.' Then he came to the disciples and found them sleeping; and he said to Peter, 'So, could you not stay awake with me one hour? Stay awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak.'

Then the clergy and servers rise and return to the Sacristy in silence. As the church is stripped, the choir sings Ps 22 Silence is kept throughout the church and its grounds on this most holy night.

The Watch at the Altar of repose is maintained until Midnight.

Please do keep watch if you can,

or alternatively return at 11.30

for the final 30 minutes of the watch before midnight.
